PROCEDURE:

Percutaneous Nephrolithotripsy

DISCHARGE INSTRUCTIONS:

- 1. It is important to drink as much fluid (non-alcoholic, non-caffeinated) as possible to wash out any blood that may accumulate. Increase your fluid intake if your urine turns red or you pass clots.
- 2. Continue to take your routine medications unless your doctor has advised you differently.
- 3. Take your antibiotic if one has been prescribed.
 - a. No Aspirin/Ibuprofen products of any kind until urine is clear; as they can make bleeding worse.
- 4. No strenuous activity (no pushing, pulling, bending, lifting, straining). Walking is allowed; stairs are ok, but no more than a few times a day.
 - a. Change the dressing over the tube site as needed if it becomes soiled.
 - b. Take your pain medication as needed, but realize that this medication
 - i. can cause constipation. This medication can also effect your
 - ii. judgment and reflexes. Take Colace (an over the counter stool softener) while on pain medicine, and use laxatives as needed for constipation.
 - c. Call your urologist. He will want to see you in 1-2 weeks.

CALL YOUR DOCTOR:

If you develop fever or chills.

If you cannot urinate.

If you develop nausea and are unable to drink fluids.
