**PROCEDURE:**

Percutaneous Tube Insertion

**DISCHARGE INSTRUCTIONS:**

- 1) Do not pull on or apply any traction to the tube.
- 2) The drainage in the tube may fluctuate in color between turbid and pink. This is to be expected because of the irritation from the tube.
- 3) Continue to take your routine medication unless your doctor has advised you differently.
- 4) The dressing pad around the tube may need to be changed periodically. This can be done by the nurse during his/her visit.
- 5) If the dressing becomes loose, place some tape over it to secure it to the skin.
- 6) You will be given a leg drainage bag.
- 7) Take any antibiotics as prescribed.
- 8) Do not take aspirin or aspirin type products for the next week.
- 9) If you develop fevers/chills, increasing redness at the tube site or increasing pain call immediately or go to the emergency room.
- 10) Call your urologist. He will want to see you in about 2 weeks.

**CALL YOUR DOCTOR:**

If the fluid in the tube becomes bright red.

If you develop fever or chills.

If you begin to experience pain at the tube site or in the bladder area.
